Hi Roger

I recently did this job ..and even I found it really easy!!!

I found that the "rough" alignment was more or less set by the juxtaposition of the two sprocketsthen I loose bolted the Mag cradle and gradually tightened down using a sight on the chain from the top of the Mag to the crank drive. Fine adjustment was easy with the OS adjustment screw and fixing.

It works!!

I am not a very good engineer - but even I found this a doddle ...do u have the fine adjuster fitted?
